EPIC Project Planning Seminar, Barcelona 2019 February 11-15

General information:

Accommodation for most students is in the Torre Girona Residence Hall, located just across the Campus Nord, where the seminar taking place. The address is Passeig dels Til·lers, 19, 08034 Barcelona. See also: http://www.resa.es/eng/Residences/Torre-Girona. You will be staying in double and triple rooms. Bed linen and towels will be available when you arrive, so you don't have to bring it. Also, there should be Wifi. There is access to laundry facilities, so you can wash your clothes during the stay, a small gym, and a social room with DVD/TV and games.

A small number of students will be staying in Hotel Bonanova Park (http://hotelbonanovapark.com), located at Calle Capitá Arenas 51, 08034 Barcelona. Students staying in the hotel will also have breakfast included there.

Meals: Breakfast is served in the Residence (for those staying there), and lunch will be served in the campus restaurant. Every night (Monday to Friday) a joint dinner will be arranged in the city, see the daily programme. The meals are all free of charge for you, as it is covered by the Erasmus+ grant.


Arriving to Barcelona (For Torre Girona Residence Hall): When you arrive to Barcelona you have different options of getting to the campus. The cheapest option is to take the metro line L9 to Zona Universitaria, and from here change line to L3 for a single stop to Palau Reial. You buy the metro tickets at the airport metro station (special ticket needed from the airport). A faster and bit more expensive option is to take the Aerobus from the airport to Placa Espanya, and change to metro L3 towards Zona Universitaria, and get off at Palau Reial. See the map on the next page.

Arriving to Bonanova Park Hotel: Similar directions, but Maria Christina Metro station is closer.

Leaving Barcelona: There are two airport terminals (Terminal 1 and Terminal 2), which are quite far apart. Make sure you go to the right one.

Transport: The campus and Torre Girona Residence hall is located quite conveniently for public transport. From the city, just take the Metro to Palau Reial (Green Line L3, towards

Zona Universitaria). You might want to buy a T10 card (valid for ten journeys on Barcelona buses and metro), which you can buy at all metro stations.



The lectures and group work take place at the university campus unless otherwise stated. It is just across the street from the Torre Girona Residence Hall.

Wireless Internet at the campus – you can use eduroam, so make sure you have enabled your eduroam account.

Insurance: As a student of EPIC, you are responsible for taking out proper travel insurance. If you are in doubt, please ask your local coordinator who can assist. It is highly recommended also to bring the European Health Insurance card.

Important stuff to bring: It is important to bring a laptop, since it will be used during the projects. Towels, linen etc. will be provided in the rooms. If you have the possibility to bring something that can be used for social activities, don't hesitate to do so.

Money: We will cover all expenses for accommodation, cultural activities, and the meals listed in the program. For other expenses, such as transport to/from the airport, local bus/tram tickets, additional food and drinks, optional cultural activities, pocket money etc. you will need to pay on your own.

Academic preparation for the seminar: All students are required to have gone through the obligatory modules in the learning platform (Ready by January 20 as described in the Student guide) and to sign up for Discord. Apart from that, different students will have made different progress with their projects before the meeting, as the semesters are different. While some students are almost 30% into the semester, others will start working in Barcelona. It is therefore important to clarify with your local coordinators if you are expected to have made progress with the project.

Note: Adjustments can be made at any time, so keep an eye on Discord where all updates and announcements will be made.
